Jiří Kačer has concentrated for many years on work with a traditional material – namely, stone, which he approaches primarily as an object. As the titles of most of his works suggest, these are actually fragments, initially derived from authentic stone remnants of historical architecture and its decoration. With the passing time his output has gradually assumed a larger scale, up to a point of turning to something close to monumental "scraps" of the universe. While some of these works still resemble archaeological finds, others have zoomorphic forms, and still others feature strictly geometrical surface structures. Their quintessentially contemporary form relates them to finds of residues of the past. There, Jiří Kačer has linked up his two professions, those of sculptor and art restorer, as his highly individual creative output evokes mesmerizing reminiscences of not just prehistorical artefacts but also paleontological discoveries. He has moreover also been duly represented at Troja in his capacity as a restorer, through his involvement in the renovation of the Baroque sculptures by the brothers Hermann lining the venue's grand staircase.

Aleš Hnízdil is likewise a stone sculptor by training, but the focus of his present concern has shifted primarily towards the ephemeral sphere of consciousness and the possibility of ideas blending and intertwining in boundless universe. These abstract works draw inspiration from the teachings of Taoism and Buddhism. Their predominantly vertical compositions of stainless steel rods rising towards the sky parallel the upward soaring ideas which live their own lives as they stream across space, interweaving it and becoming one with the universe. Hnízdil's interest in Oriental philosophy dates back to his secondary-school years. He has long sought an appropriate way of embedding the principles of these systems of thought into the language of art. He started out with figural output, to abandon it in the early 1990s for pared-down compositions, with a view to getting closer to the canon of spontaneous existence that is in full accord with the laws of nature.
