



START UP VII JIŘÍ ŽÁK / THE SHATTERED EPISTEMOLOGIST

And while you're studying that reality – judiciously, as you will – we'll act again, creating other new realities, which you can study too, and that's how things will sort out. In the exhibition spaces of City Gallery Prague dedicated to art by young artists, the gallery presents the latest work by Jiří Žák, a graduate of Tomáš Vaněk's Studio of Intermedia Art at the Academy of Fine Arts and a winner of the 2015 Exit Award. Žák's video entitled *The Shattered Epistemologist*, created during the artist's time in Berlin, represents the climax of his two-year period of creating video essays, during which his approach to this genre has radically evolved – from the use, analysis, and re-contextualization of archival footage (*Second Person Singular*, 2015, and *Mother City*, 2015), he has moved towards the creation of autonomous experimental fiction films. A central point of reference in Žák's most recent works is the legacy of well-known British experimental filmmaker John Akomfrah, the author of incisive documentary syntheses, converted into a specific poetically-founded artistic language.

In his latest video, *The Shattered Epistemologist*, Žák collaborates with the charismatic Berlin-based German-Beninese dancer Meïmouna Coffi. Working with a script by Žák, Coffi has created an improvised dance choreography based, among other things, on the physical gestures we use when we operate digital equipment. A collage of dance sequences and blurry, abstract footage — is a visual-poetic metaphor, accompanied by a subjective verbal and text-based commentary that places the fictitious situations within a real and specific context.

The Shattered Epistemologist is centered around the semantic properties of "truth" and "post-truth", in the context of the modern era's information smog and media manipulation. It refers to the current debate surrounding "post-truth," a term whose usage increased by more than 2000% last year, earning it the title of Oxford Dictionary's 2016 Word of the Year.

"The only thing that matters is what seems real to you. You have the right to exploit objective meaning for your own purposes," says one of the figures in *The Shattered Epistemologist*. "From the position of a consumer of today's information explosion, accelerated by social networks and by the altogether unclear role of gatekeepers, it is becoming increasingly more difficult to find a solid footing. Whereas in the past, people searched for ways of recognizing the truth through reason or the senses, today we are faced by the problem of being alienated from the processes of perception. All sensory and partially also rational experience of the individual is increasingly mediated by fragmented virtual information. The senses are losing their relevance; reason has become overloaded. Since we generally cannot verify the truthfulness of information, we can only guess at which of its increasingly more numerous versions to adopt as our own. Just as the word 'post-truth' has become the word of the year, so too has the theory of knowledge (epistemology) become a more frequent subject of discourse. The subjectivization of reality is a good reason to engage in the difficult task of looking for new ways of formulating fundamental principles of knowledge that, despite their emphasis on the individual, do not lose sight of humankind," says curator Jitka Hlaváčková.
