What if I see something completely different from others? What is observed and what is imagined? What is experienced and what is real? And if I interconnect all the parts, do I see the whole?

The procedural thinking and processes of creating pictures that you can see in the exhibition of the artistic duo David Böhm and Jiří Franta prepared for the House of Photography are reminiscent of the theory of the uncertainty principle by philosopher and quantum physicist Werner Heisenberg. The schizophrenic nature of the installation, seemingly replicating itself on both floors of the gallery, evokes a sense of blurred vision, double perception and a division of the viewer's perspectives. However, it also offers a range of familiar and subconscious meanings and questions.

For over twenty years, Jiří Franta and David Böhm have been exploring living processes that are directly rooted in a particular place and in themes present in it. The external connection is the principle of drawing which, however, absorbs all imaginable creative processes. It becomes painting, expands into space, reproduces and develops itself. Above all, however, its centre of gravity shifts to various forms of performative and action situations, where elements of Dada and chance mix with post-conceptual approaches.

The venue, the House of Photography of Prague City Gallery, brought the theme of recording, reproduction and the forms of their dissemination and sharing. The theme of photography which, as the theorist Geoffrey Batchen states, is nowadays not created with the aim of being printed and becoming a permanent document, but with the desire to be shared. Not as a material object but as an image – visual information – and its reflection in social space with the ability to take on the form of diverse media, styles and formats. And each of these images exists in an infinite number of versions that can exist simultaneously in many places and on different temporal planes.

In this way of thinking, the prototype of shared information became the children's encyclopaedia, *Už vím proč* (Already Know Why) (1980) by Mr. and Mrs. Škoda, with illustrations by Vojtěch Kubašta, which the artists knew very well. It is a structured list of natural phenomena and human inventions,





the essence of which is explained in a clear and uncomplicated way. The questions raised by perusal of the encyclopedia by adults proved to be varied and mostly pressing: How to make do with encyclopedic entries in an age when the world has ceased to consist of individual phenomena, but is increasingly a network of unknowable relationships? How to access information where no two observers see the same thing in the same way? How to arrive at a consensus when each of the actors tells a different story?

The authors of the exhibition - as is their habit - do not give answers, they only state that, unlike in their childhood, today they know that they no longer want to understand everything. What is left is to accept reality without the possibility of grasping it rationally. To perceive through intuition, senses and emotions, which in the end always decide whether we agree with each other or end up in war. That is why the guiding principle in the preparation of the exhibition was creative experimentation, play and chance which bring contact with living reality and its inherent principles of indeterminacy and entropy.

The two artists, together and each in their own way, explored the possibilities and limits of painting through dynamic and often unpredictable processes in the studio interior and in the open air. For approaching nature / the original means at the same time moving away from the world of reproductions in the form of digital technologies and networks in which we are captured, stuck in a place that looks less and less like our dreams and fantasies and more and more like our psychoses.
